

Puget Sound Antique Tractor and Machinery Association Safety Regulations.

Safety is the primary goal for the Puget Sound Antique Tractor and Machinery Association. It is everyone's responsibility to demonstrate safety and to adhere to PSATMA Safety Regulations when operating equipment.

For all pulling rules see pulling registration. For working and running gas engine displays, see information booth for rules and regulations. **If you see a safety issue, report it.**

All tractors and displays will be set up in the designated areas approved by the Show Director or the PSATMA board.

All vehicles parking on show grounds must have a valid vehicle pass that clearly shows the vendor/driver name and current phone number displayed on the mirror. No vehicles will be allowed to park on to the show grounds after 10:00am without a valid pass and visible contact information.

All motorized vehicles, tractors and lawn tractors moving on the show grounds must be limited to no more than a brisk walking pace/5 mph. All traffic will drive counter clockwise on designated Showground roads only, unless otherwise noted by signage.

Driving on the north show grounds (north of the tree line where the bathrooms and barricades are located) is prohibited for one to two hours after the end of parade. The closure time depends on how long the children's activities last at the announcer's stand. Only ONE passenger will be allowed on any tractor while moving unless proper secondary seating or standing provisions have been made and approved by the Show Director or Board. Absolutely NO riding on steps, axles, fenders or draw bars.

Drivers on show grounds must have a valid driver's license or a PSATMA Youth Driver's Safety Program License. For information on how to obtain a Youth License, visit the Information Booth.

Club machinery or rented equipment is to be operated by Pulling Committee or Board authorized personnel only. These persons must be qualified and of age to operate the equipment they intend to use. Proper clothing must be worn, no open toe shoes.

If an accident is to occur, activity will be stopped immediately. The Safety Director, Show Director and/or President will review the incident using the PSATMA accident review plan. A copy of this plan is available at the information booth.

No dogs or bicycles on the show grounds during event hours (registered service dogs are welcome).

No tractors/lawnmowers/equipment is allowed in designated camping areas.

Alcohol is not permitted on event grounds.
